About the Story Factory:

We're a not-for-profit that runs creative writing and storytelling workshops for young people aged 7 to 17 in under-resourced communities. Supported by our community of expert storytellers and volunteer tutors, young people are empowered to create stories of all kinds, which we publish and celebrate. Young people develop the skills and confidence to find their voice and shape the future.

Most of our programs run once a week for a term (6-8 weeks) in primary and high schools across Sydney and Western Sydney, reaching up to 1,000 young people a week. Programs are on a wide range of topics, from climate fiction to traversing traditional lands across Australia; stories of being trapped in an amusement park to Instapoetry. All programs end in a handsome publication which students can take home as a lasting record of their achievement. A Theory of Change underpins all our programs, which are designed to build writing skills and creativity, and help young people find their voice.

Since opening in 2012, our achievements include:

- 40,000+ student enrolments, with nearly 8,000 enrolments in 2021;
- 18% Indigenous and 44% from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds;
- Building a corps of over 400 trained volunteer writing tutors;
- Recognition of our work with multiple awards, including a Secretary's Award for Excellence in the 2018 Public Education Foundation Awards.

Story Factory has centres in Redfern and Parramatta. The Senior Program Manager with work across both, and can be based at either.

The role:

The Senior Program Manager leads the delivery of all Story Factory's in-school creative writing programs. Their job is to support and work collaboratively with our team of 13 storytellers to ensure that Story Factory workshops are of the highest quality, aligned with our Theory of Change, and make the greatest possible difference in the lives of the young people we work with.

Story FACTORY

This is a busy, dynamic role which involves continuously improving our suite of programs, and supporting our talented team to deliver them. It also involves creating engaging new programs for a diverse cohort of primary and high school students, and building the skills of our Storytelling team through a combination of personalised feedback and professional development.

The ideal candidate will be an exceptional, experienced educator with a proven talent for nurturing creativity and building skills not only in young people, but also in their peers. They will be a qualified teacher with at least five years teaching experience and management experience. They will be highly creative and adaptable, with a passion for writing. The Senior Program Manager will be a key part of Story Factory's senior management group, providing input into both day-to-day decision making and long-term strategy for the organisation.

Story Factory is a Child Safe Organisation. The Senior Program Manager will ensure our Storytelling team adheres to our Code of Conduct at all times, and be a role model in all matters of child safety.

Key Position Priorities and Duties:

- Support and train our Storytelling staff to deliver our suite of creative writing programs to primary and high school students, to the highest standard. Also work with the team to continuously refine and improve programs, and differentiate delivery and outcomes to best meet the needs of diverse students.
- Guide the Storytelling team through the conception, development and refinement of high quality lesson plans and classroom resources, and oversee their production.
- Work with the Storytelling team to develop new programs for primary and high-school students, aligned to our Theory of Change, and support staff to deliver them.
- Work with our Aboriginal Engagement Manager to ensure all programs are culturally appropriate and where possible incorporate Indigenous perspectives and content. Also work with the Aborginal Engagement Manager to identify opportunities to best support our Indigenous students.
- Observe and give constructive feedback to staff as they deliver workshops and identify opportunities for professional development. Regularly run internal professional development sessions for staff and support them to undertake external PD as needed.
- Work with our two Senior Storytellers on the day-to-day management of our team of 13 Storytellers. This includes managing storytellers on issues including performance, working with volunteers in workshops, ensuring all administration tasks are completed and other workplace issues.
- With the Storyteller-in-Chief, oversee the evaluation of programs and assist with feeding back results into program refinement.
- Story Factory complies with the National Principles for Child Safe Organisations. The Senior Program Manager is the organisation's Child Safety Contact Person for all issues arising out of regular in-school programs, and works with the Storyteller-in-Chief, and the Story Engineer to ensure compliance with these principles at all times.

Selection Criteria:

Essential

- 1. A teaching qualification and 5+ years of experience teaching creative writing/English.
- 2. Strong management skills, including experience managing teachers or others in an education setting.
- 3. A passion for writing and creativity, and for developing these skills in young people, particularly young people in under-resourced communities.
- 4. Demonstrated ability to conceive of one-off and term-long creative writing programs for students, ideally in primary and high school settings.
- 5. Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with diverse people in an educational setting.
- 6. Strong organisational and administrative skills.

Desirable

- 1. Experience working with young Indigenous people, people from culturally diverse backgrounds, and students with particular learning and social support needs
- 2. Current driver's licence.
